We administer Communion by “priestly intinction”, which involves the priest dipping a piece of consecrated bread into the consecrated wine and placing it in the communicant’s hands. We will therefore administer Communion as follows:

As you approach the altar, please gel your hands.

Move to either side of the altar as usual where the priest will offer you the consecrated bread which has been dipped into the consecrated wine and place it in your hands.

If you wish to receive a blessing rather than Communion, please take your service sheet with you.

Return to your seat via the side aisles as usual.

If you would like gluten free bread at Communion, please just ask.
